ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE:

"Success is dependent on effort and success is the sum of small efforts" Yet again another academic year of success and achievement unfolded with the CBSE board results. The students of our school brought laurels by getting 98.5% pass percentage and the Excellence index of the school was 73.5.

68 students appeared for the AISSE exam and 10 students scored A1 grade in all subjects. 3 students secured 100 marks in Science and 2 students secured 100 marks in Artificial Intelligence. 1 student each in English, Social Science and Mathematics secured 100 marks.

STUDENT WORKSHOPS

AYURVEDA FOR STUDENTS' HEALTH

The students were divided into batches of 8 to 10 and were conducting experiments on the topics - Optics, Magnetism, Microscope, Acid Base Reactions and Archimedes Principle. The students had an enriching hands-on session.

Oral Hygiene

The students of Class V were made aware of the importance of oral health and hygiene by a group of doctors from BARC Dental Dept. The interactive session enlightened the young learners on various aspects of dental care and the need to practice good oral hygiene.

TIFR - Visit

Students of Class IX visited TIFR on 27 November, 2022. The session started with an introduction about history of TIFR and the purpose behind its establishment, followed by demonstration of Chemistry activities by senior scientists. Then the students visited different laboratories and gained valuable rich practical experience.

Vigyan Pratibha is a novel initiative of Government of India for extended nurture of talent in Science and Mathematics among schools students. Under the guidance of HBCSE, activities were conducted in school for the students of Class VIII and IX.
