ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE:

One of the most common measures of success is the academic performance of students, and we feel nothing less than proud and elated to highlight the amazing class X results of 2023-24.

The students of our school brought laurels by not just getting 100% pass percentage and an Excellence index of 96.34, but also a quality index of 8.2

82 students appeared for the AISSE exam and 18 students scored above 90% aggregate marks. 76 students out of 82 scored more than 60% marks. Additionally, 4 students secured 100 marks in Artificial Intelligence and 1 student each in Hindi and Mathematics secured a centum.
